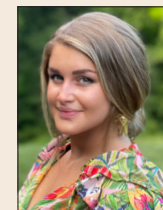

Sherrill Digital Transformation Update

In 2021, we started our digital transformation and kicked off our first major project: a multi-year effort to consolidate all branded sites, B2B sites, and commerce needs into one website running on the latest ecommerce platform that will deliver a best-in-class visual configurator. The new site will allow our customers to configure their product and see a near-photo quality version in real time. The new platform will also support High Point Market and allow the sales team to manage orders for samples, new introductions, and in-line styles during our Spring and Fall Markets. As we draw closer to our April 2024 launch date, I am happy to report that we are on schedule and have made noteworthy progress in creating CGI models of most upholstery programs and over 450 in-line frames. The next phase will focus on casegood programs and in-line SKUs.

I am excited to share that we have formally kicked off our next two transformative IT projects that will have positive impacts on our customer and vendor relationships. The first and largest project, which started earlier this year, is a rewrite of all systems to a modern user interface with more automation and easier access to information. The new systems will integrate with our visual configurator to allow for seamless communication of products and orders between our customer-facing portals and our back-end systems that run the factories. The entire project is expected to take 5-6 years. We've already started rolling out some changes and you'll see several more by the end of this year.

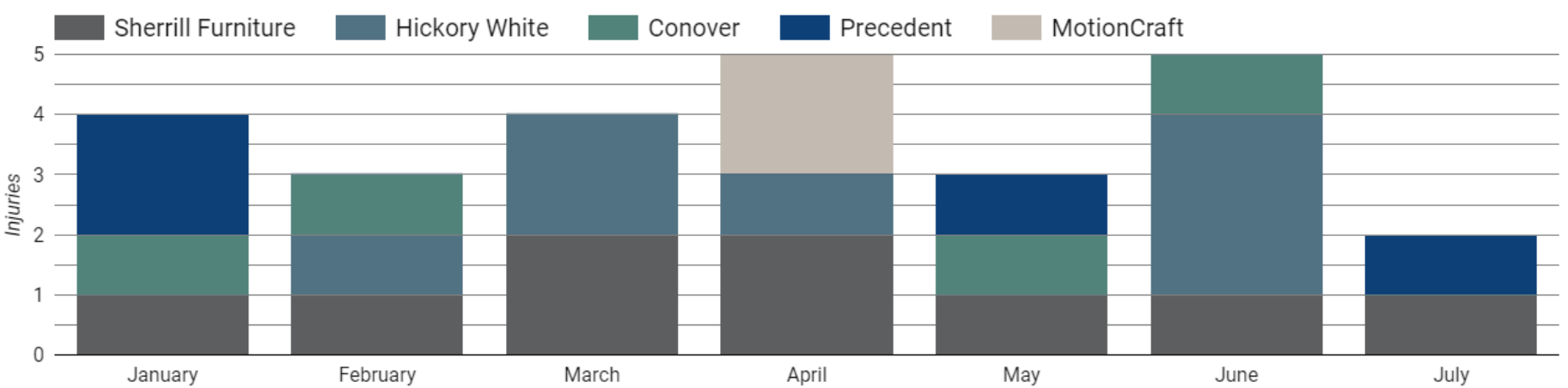

What's Next at Hickory White for the Fall 2023?

As the world of furniture returns to what we remember as “normal,” the Hickory White team has been hard at work doing what we do best: crafting exceptional American-made products from our 100-year-old factory in North Carolina! While many companies try to be all things to all people, at Hickory White, we know where our strengths lie, and that is in traditional, luxurious casegoods and upholstery, where customization is the norm.

This fall, we have expanded our Features Upholstery Program, offering customers the option of choosing unique style arms, backs, and legs to create any look that suits their design aesthetic. Our design team added 20 new Hickory White fabrics to the program to give our customers more variety. We also developed several new arm styles to give the Features Program more depth and our consumers a more diverse selection.

Hickory White Casegoods will introduce 15 new pieces this season. The REVIVAL 81 Collection, introduced in October 2022, was widely successful and has now started to ship to our customers. This season, we are adding to this collection by introducing a new 60-inch Redmond Dining Table, Breland Bunching Cabinet, and a new upholstered bed called Lander, inspired by the best-selling Teton Sofa.

Hickory White is focusing on introducing beautiful sycamore veneers on a new traditional cocktail table, end table, and arched cabinet. You will also find materials such as textured metal in a sleek satin brass finish throughout our casegoods introductions.

We will be introducing three new finishes on our highly figured veneered tables: Olive Leaf, which is a rich and saturated green finish found in nature, Raven Wings with a natural living look like the spread of a Raven's wing; and Belvedere, a deep brown color reminiscent of a Cuban cigar.

We are so fortunate and proud of the artisans and furniture makers from the Catawba Valley region that have chosen Hickory White as their home and create beautiful furniture for our retailers and designers that will last for generations. We can't wait for you to see their work and craftsmanship come to life!

CPSC Insight and Product Design Impact

The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) announced on April 19, 2023, that a new, mandatory standard will be required for all products classified as a clothing storage unit manufactured after September 1, 2023. A clothing storage unit is described as a free-standing unit including but not limited to chests, chests of drawers, armoires, bureaus, door chests, and dressers that are 27 inches or greater in height, 30 pounds or greater in weight and contain 3.2 cubic feet or greater of enclosed storage volume. Our Hickory staff has been working for five months on solutions to ensure all our applicable storage furniture meets the requirements set by the CPSC.

The CPSC passed this standard to reduce the possibility of furniture tipping over on children and causing harm or death. As I develop new casegoods for Sherrill Furniture, I am aware of this new requirement. The design elements I look at are the size and shape of the furniture, along with specific measurements that make the furniture heavier at the back of the case. This new mandatory requirement has been challenging, but as a mother and aunt, it is something I take very seriously. Since 1945 our customers have put their trust in Sherrill Furniture. They can be confident that we are aware of all types of government and safety standards to ensure our furniture is safe for the children in our lives.

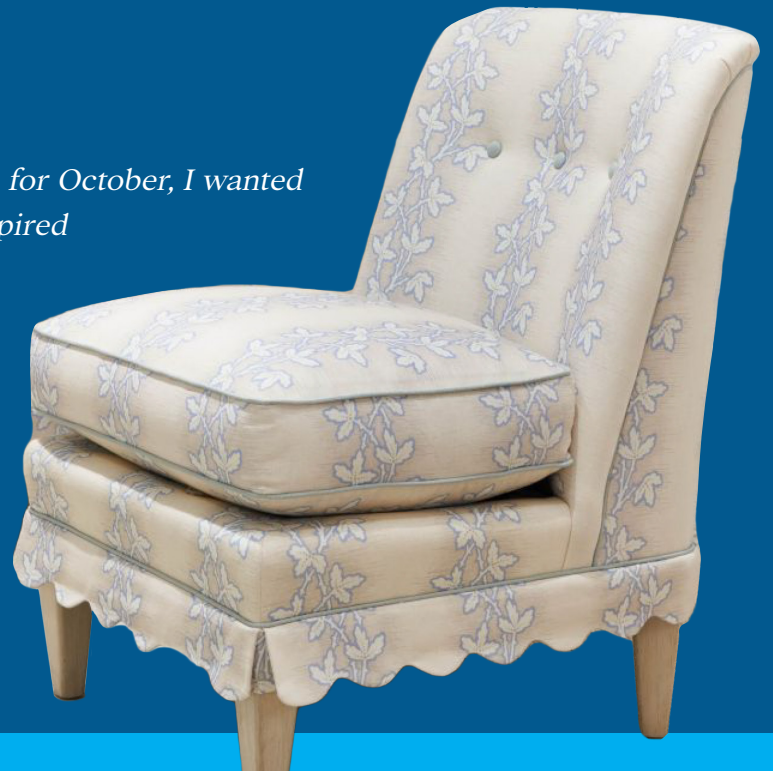

The second significant project is the EDI systems for business-to-business automation and transaction automation. This system will automate transactions between Sherrill, our vendors, and customers that utilize EDI for transmitting purchase orders, acknowledgements, ASNs, invoices, and other documents. With this in place, we will reduce the manual processes required to convert a customer PO into an order and send automatic acknowledgements, ASNs, and invoices that go directly into their systems. EDI will reduce the order errors and the administrative efforts required for managing orders and the order fulfillment process, allowing us to focus more time on customer service.

Sherrill Occasional Insight & New Products

Sherrill Occasional has been a part of the Sherrill Furniture family since the mid-1970s. During this time, Sherrill Occasional has become a go-to resource for occasional tables and accent products to retail stores and interior designers. Our primary goal is to provide a variety of occasional tables and accent furniture to support Sherrill Furniture upholstery brands with a timeless design aesthetic and excellent quality that will last for many years.

For the upcoming October 2023 Market, we will be introducing approximately 35 new items. This includes smaller accent tables and chests, a dining table, four eclectic cocktail tables, and two new occasional table groups. These items will feature captivating materials such as beautiful veneers, including walnut, ash, oak, figured eucalyptus, and walnut burl woods. Other intriguing elements include metal, plaster, shell, rattan, copper, abaca rope, travertine, and marble.

We are introducing two new occasional groups. The first group, Copeland, is produced in Vietnam out of oak solids and oak veneers. The drawer fronts are hand-carved with a botanical pattern that offers a fresh, natural look. Copeland will be inventoried in Hickory and available in most Sherrill Occasional finishes giving our customers more flexibility and creativity as they can create their own look, whether it be more coastal or a more traditional vibe, depending on the finish selected.

The second occasional group, Truman, named after OT Sherrill, complements the Truman Sofa that debuted in April 2023. The Truman Sofa has been incredibly successful, so the Sherrill team is expanding the offering, adding a chair, with or without swivel, and ottoman. Last market, this sofa was available in six fabrics for a competitive price of \$995. In October, they will increase the fabric offering to approximately 60 fabrics and give customers custom cushion options at an upcharge. The Truman Occasional Table group has a versatile design, including a tapered leg and a clipped corner. Made of ash solids and ash veneers the overall style and aesthetic of this group are determined by the finish selected by the customer giving the tables the flexibility to fit in almost any home.

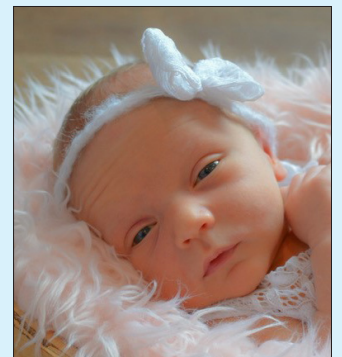
