In the beginning of the Covid-19 virus pandemic, Sherrill Furniture heard the cry of medical equipment shortages from community health professionals. We answered a request from a local hospital to donate all of the N95 masks we had on hand from our company supply. Then we sought ways we could do more during these uncertain times.

Hearing that other furniture manufacturers, small sewing shops, home craftspeople and even small church groups were making masks, Sherrill took a slightly different direction. We did not want to produce an inferior product that might offer false protection and endanger medical providers. Times were desperate and medical providers were on the front lines taking risks daily in the fight against Covid-19, using inadequate PPE.

William Smith and our team contacted the Catawba County Economic Development Corp. This contact and the willingness of our

community to find a solution established a partnership, bringing several other furniture manufacturers to the table where we could all combine our resources and government contacts.

Our group then managed to connect with a similar group of textile experts under the Carolina Textile District and Industrial Commons. These partnerships helped further our synergies to test, develop and manufacture a dependable personal protective product that met medical standards and provided the safety and protection community health professionals could rely on. These materials and designs were tested and approved in the Catawba County Manufacturing Solutions Center laboratory, which specializes in textile products.

Our Sherrill family was able to spring into action and assist with the initial demand. The CTD was able to provide





As of May 2020, we have been operating at normal speed in all four of the Sherrill Furniture Company factories. With more than 1 million square feet of manufacturing and office space, we have taken into account protective measures for the health and safety of our employees. We are accepting orders and adjusting to the "new normal" to maximize manufacturing while maintaining the N.C. Department of Health and CDC guidelines such as social distancing, mask wearing at all times, increased hand washing and

sanitizing as well as bi-weekly deep cleanings of the offices and factories.

We are pleased to announce we will be transitioning this method of health and safety to our High Point showrooms this fall. The Sherrill Furniture Companies will be showing and participating in the October market. To ensure safety, we will have increased cleaning, hand washing and sanitizing stations.
